



#### CHIPSTEAD VILLAGE FLOWER SHOW AND FAIR

#### Rules of the Show

- All exhibits must be the property of the Exhibitor and must have been in his/her possession for at least two months.
- The Committee reserves the right to inspect the gardens or allotments of all Exhibitors one week before the date of the Show. All entries both paper and online to be in by Friday 7<sup>th</sup> July 2023. No entries after this date or on the show day will be accepted.
- 3. The Committee reserves the right to refuse any entry or exhibit and, in the event of such right being exercised, the Committee is not required to give any reason or explanation.
- Any objection must be made in writing to one of the Committee not later than 4.30 pm on the day of the Show.
- 5. Exhibitors must supply their own plates, vases etc. Exhibits may be staged from 8.00 am on the day of the Show. No exhibit may be staged after 10.00 am and must remain staged until 5.00 pm, unless otherwise authorised by the Chairman. Judging will commence at 10.00 am and no person may be in the marquee when this takes place, unless in an official capacity.
- 6. Horticultural Classes will be judged according to the rules and standards contained in the Royal Horticultural Show handbook 2016 (available from the Committee), except where, under this schedule, they obviously do not apply. Numbers of vegetables and fruit are as listed on Page 15 unless otherwise specified in the section. In the event of close competition, the naming of varieties and arrangement of entries will be taken into account.
- 7. The Judges' decision will be final.
- 8. No Exhibitor may have more than one entry in any one class.
- Entries, other than pot plants, must not have been previously exhibited at the Chipstead Village Flower Show and Fair.
- 10. In Classes where only one entry is received, a First Prize shall not necessarily be given but it shall be left to the Judges to award a prize according to the standard of the exhibit.
- 11. Trophies and children's vouchers will be presented at 4.30 pm. Any prizes not collected will be held by one of the Committee for collection, and if not collected within one month will be treated as a contribution to funds. Trophy winners will also receive a certificate in the coming weeks after the show. NOTE: Trophies will no longer be engraved as of this year. All trophies awarded in 2023 must be returned to Mrs Rosine Traisneau, 22 Portnalls Rise, Coulsdon, CR5 3DA, Tel: 01737 556575 not later than 30<sup>th</sup> June 2024.
- 12. The Committee will take all reasonable care of exhibits but will not be responsible for any loss or damage from any cause whatsoever. They will not be responsible for any accident arising from any cause whatsoever to any person assisting, exhibiting or visiting the show, or for any loss or damage howsoever caused to the property of any person.
- 13. No dogs or smoking allowed in the Show Marquee.
- 14. **FOR SCHOOLS ONLY** Entries in Sections F and G should be made based on the age of the child when the work was completed. Please date the entries.
- 15. Entry forms **WILL NOT** be accepted via our email address only via the online entry form or the form printed in this schedule.

Note: Exhibitors' Entry Cards will be available for collection outside the Marquee on the Saturday morning of the show day

- 34. Vase of six stems of "Lavandula" (lavender) with own foliage.
- 35. Six "Fuchsia" flowers. Stands provided for individual heads.
- 36. One potted "Pelargonium"/"Geranium", can be ivy leafed.
- 37. One potted tuberous or fibrous "Begonia".
- 38. One potted "Begonia" grown from seed.
- 39. Five pansy/viola flowers to be shown on plate in sand or water.
- 40. One potted foliage plant, can include Hosta.
- 41. Two potted plants of the same variety.
- 42. Vase of three "Dahlia" blooms of the same species, named, to include some foliage but no buds. THE ROGER MARTIN CUP may be awarded to the winner of Class 42. Winner in 2022: John Wates
- 43. One vase of annual Lathyrus (Sweet Peas).
- 44. Container of six similar blooms not annual Lathyrus.

THE RAYMOND PRICE TROPHY presented by the late Mr. Raymond Price may be awarded to the Winner of Class 44.

Winner in 2022: Wendy Bedford

45. A display of three individual pot plants of different varieties. One plant per pot.

- 46. Container of 6 or more different garden cut flowers.
- 47. Container of cut flowering shrubs.
- 48. Container of cut perennial flowers, not shrubs.
- 49. One hanging display of your own outstanding choice of mixed plants. In a container not smaller than 37 cm diameter. Stand will be provided.
- 50. One potted "Fuchsia".
- 51. Three fern fronds.
- 52. A planted display in a container not exceeding 60 cm diameter (tub) or 90 cm long (trough). Individual pots not accepted.
- 53. One vase of foliage with not less than four different examples.
- 54. One potted "Hosta".
- 55. Three types of flowers in separate vases.



250g courgettes, grated coarsely, 175g butter, softened, 175g caster sugar, 3 large eggs, 1tsp vanilla essence, 100g ricotta,125g gluten free plain flour, 85g polenta, 2 and a half tsp baking powder, ½ tsp bicarbonate of soda, 2 lemons finely zested, juice of 1 lemon, thyme sprigs, 4tbsp icing sugar

#### Method:

Preheat the oven to 180°C fan, gas mark 4. Grease and line a 900g loaf tin. Put the courgettes onto a plate lined with kitchen paper then cover with more kitchen paper and top with a plate. Allow the paper to absorb all the excess liquid. Cream together the butter and sugar until pale looking. Gradually beat in the eggs followed by the vanilla and ricotta. Mix the dry ingredients together with a 1/4 tsp salt and sift into the mix, fold in with care, now add the courgettes MOST of the lemon zest and a few leaves from the lemon thyme. Spoon into the prepared tin and bake for an hour. To test readiness insert a skewer into the centre of the cake if it comes out clean it is ready. Leave cake in tin to cool. Mix lemon juice, icing sugar and a few thyme leaves drizzle over the top. Leave to set.

#### Tomato and caramelised onion tart tatin (Page 26)

250g puff pastry,4 beef tomatoes, sliced widthways,1tbsp olive oil,1 large red onion, sliced into rings, 2 cloves garlic, finely chopped. 2 tbsp white balsamic vinegar, 2tsps sugar salt and pepper, 4-5 sprigs thyme

#### Method

Preheat the oven to 190°C, Gas mark 6. Roll out the pastry to fit the top of an ovenproof frying pan, (alternately use a sandwich cake tin) Heat the oil and soften the onion rings, not too brown! add the garlic and cook for 2 minutes more. Remove the onions from the pan, stir in the vinegar, sugar and thyme, bubble until slightly reduced. Arrange the tomatoes and onions into the balsamic glaze. Season with salt and pepper. Top with the pastry and press down at the edges. Cook for 20 -25 minutes until golden brown on top, rest for 5 mins and then invert onto a serving plate.

#### Bakewell tart (Page 26)

A 23cm, 9" ovenproof plate

Pastry: 175g plain flour,90g butter, 1 rounded tbsp caster sugar, pinch salt,1 egg yolk.


4tbsps red jam, 125g ground almonds, 125g caster sugar 50g butter, softened,3 medium eggs, beaten 1/4 tsp almond essence

#### Method:

Preheat the to oven 180°C fan, 200°C, gas mark 6. Rub the butter into the flour until it resembles breadcrumbs. Stir in the sugar and salt, add the yolk with 2 tbsp cold water mix together to form a dough. Knead gently, wrap in cling film and chill for 30 mins. Roll out pastry and fit to the base of the plate, mark up the edges with the prongs of a fork. Spread over the jam. Chill. Meanwhile beat the ground almonds, caster sugar, butter, eggs, and almond essence together in a bowl. Pour over the jam spread evenly. bake in the oven for 10 mins then reduce the temp by 100C and cook for a further 20 mins dust with icing sugar before serving.
